Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month

Unhealthy relationship behaviors often start early and lead to a lifetime of abuse. Every student, parent and teacher needs to be aware of the prevalence of teen dating violence. Here are some facts about teen dating violence:

1. Each year approximately one in four adolescents reports verbal, physical, emotional or sexual abuse.
2. Dating violence among their peers is reported by 54% of high school students.
3. One in three teens report knowing a friend or peer who has been physically hurt by his or her partner through violent actions which included hitting, punching, kicking, slapping, and/or choking.
4. Eighty percent of teens believe verbal abuse is a serious issue for their age group.
5. Nearly 80% of girls who have been victims of physical abuse in their dating relationships continue to date the abuser.
6. Nearly 20% of teen girls who have been in a relationship said that their boyfriend had threatened violence or self-harm in the event of a break-up.
7. Nearly 70% of young women who have been raped knew their rapist; the perpetrator was or had been a boyfriend, friend, or casual acquaintance.

It is never too early to begin talking with children and teens about healthy relationships and what is and is not acceptable. If you know of a teen experiencing dating violence, we are here to help.
